Travel

Kennington Park ground is easily accessible using all modes of transport. Click here for the [Tfl Accessible Tube Map](#)

Underground

The nearest tube stations are Oval and Kennington (Northern Line), but these do not have step-free access.

Vauxhall Station (Victoria line) is the nearest tube and main line station with step-free access, so it is wheelchair accessible. This is around fifteen minutes' walk from the courts.

Buses

All Transport for London (TFL) bus routes are wheelchair accessible and have clearly marked priority seats for people with limited mobility. On most buses the wheelchair ramp is positioned at the exit door and there is one wheelchair user place on each bus. The main bus

stops close to Kennington Park are located on Camberwell New Road, Kennington Park road, Kennington Road and Brixton Road.

Several bus routes pass close to the park including the 185 which goes from Victoria towards Lewisham Station, the 36 which goes from Queens Park towards New Cross Gate, the 436 which goes from Battersea Park Station towards Lewisham Shopping Centre, the 415 which goes from Old Kent Road to Tulse Hill station, the 59 from Euston towards Streatham Hill, the 133 from Streatham Station to Liverpool Street, the 3 from Crystal Palace towards Whitehall, the 333 from Tooting Broadway to Elephant & Castle and the 155 from Tooting to Elephant & Castle.

Taxis

All London Style 'Black Cabs' are wheelchair accessible and can provide a suitable alternative to the bus or car. Black cabs can be hailed (stopped) in the street, however you may prefer to book a cab to travel to or from the facility.

Uber Taxis also provide Wheelchair Accessible Vehicles (WAV). To book Download the Uber app and create your account (unless you already have one) then choose the 'uberWAV' option on the slider at the bottom of the screen and follow the instructions. There are no designated drop off/pick up point outside the facility. However, suggested drop off/ pick up points are along Kennington Park Road or Camberwell New Road.

All entrances to the park give step-free access. Both access points on Camberwell New Road are other 150cm wide. All gates at the access points are permanently held open.

Parking

The facility is situated in an area with extensive parking restrictions. Blue Badge holders can park in the surrounding roads in vacant on-street Blue Badge bays. The dimensions of the marked Blue Badge bays are 200cm x 660cm (6ft 7in x 21ft 8in). Clearly signed and/or standard marked parking bays are not available. Please ensure that your Blue Badge and clock are clearly displayed. Please check the Blue Badge parking signage carefully before parking.

The venue does not have its own car park. There is not a car park for public use within 200m (approx).

Accessible features at the venue

Accessible Toilets

There is pictorial signage on or near the toilet door. This accessible toilet is approximately 42m (45yd 2ft) from the St Agnes Park entrance. This accessible toilet is located to the right as you enter via the St Agnes Park entrance.

There is not level access to this accessible toilet.

This is a shared toilet. A key is required for the accessible toilet. The key is a radar key. The door opens outwards. The door is locked by a locking handle. The width of the accessible toilet door is 75cm (2ft 6in). The door is easy to open. The dimensions of the accessible toilet are 150cm x 229cm (4ft 11in x 7ft 6in). There is sufficient turning space in the cubicle for a wheelchair user. There is a lateral transfer space. As you face the toilet pan the transfer space is on the left. The lateral transfer space is 82cm (2ft 8in). There is a dropdown rail on the transfer side. There is a flush on the transfer side. The tap type is lever. There is not a mixer tap. There is an emergency alarm. The emergency pull cord alarm is fully functional. Disposal facilities are not available in the cubicle. There is not a/are not coat hook(s).

Wall mounted grab rails are available for the toilet. As you face the toilet the wall-mounted grab rails are on

both sides. There is not a shelf within the accessible toilet. There is not a mirror. The height of the toilet seat above floor level is 48cm (1ft 7in). There is not a hand dryer. There is not a towel dispenser. There is not a toilet roll holder. There is a wash basin. The wash basin can be reached from seated on the toilet. The wash basin is not placed higher than 74cm (2ft 5in).

The contrast between the external door and wall is good. The contrast between the internal door and wall is poor. The contrast between the wall-mounted grab rail(s) and wall is good. The contrast between the dropdown rail(s) and wall is good. The contrast between the walls and floor is good. The lighting levels are moderate to good.



Non accessible Toilets

The female and male toilet facilities that were surveyed are located to the right as you enter via the St Agnes

Place entrance.

The female and male toilets are approximately 35m (38yd 10in) from the St Agnes Place entrance. Inside the venue, there is not level access to the female and male toilets.

Lighting levels in the female and male toilets are moderate to good.

There is a ramp/slope to access this area/service. The ramp or slope is located on the path leading to the entrance. The ramp/slope gradient is slight.



Changing Places Toilet Facility

The Changing Places Toilet (CPT) is located to the right as you enter the changing block.

The facility is 6m (6yd 1ft) from the changing room entrance. The door opens outwards. The width of the

door is 87cm (2ft 10in). The door is locked by a locking handle. The dimensions of the accessible changing room are 187cm x 290cm (6ft 2in x 9ft 6in). The toilet does have an unobstructed minimum turning space of 150cm x 150cm. As you face the toilet pan the transfer space is on the right. The lateral transfer space is 116cm (3ft 10in). There is a dropdown rail on the transfer side. There is a flush on the transfer side. Wall mounted rails are available. The toilet seat is 48cm (1ft 7in) above floor level. The sink can be reached from seated on the toilet. The height of the sink is 69cm (2ft 3in). The tap type is lever. There is a mixer tap. There is an emergency alarm in the cubicle. There is not a locker within the accessible changing room. There is not a changing bench. There is a wheel in shower. The shower has an adjustable shower head. The height of the seat is 46cm (1ft 6in).

Tactile Guidance Pathway

There are Tactile Guidance Pathways that our blind and visually impaired members can use to navigate their way around the facility. The pathways begin on the XXXX and XXXX at the north and east side of the facility and guide our visually impaired visitors around the site to XXXXX at the southern end at the stadium.
