


About UCL Press

All books and journals are published open access and are available to read for free as downloadable PDFs.



Core aim: to publish scholarly monographs, textbooks and journals

Since 2015, UCL Press has published:

- Over 30 access books
- 7 academic journals
- 7 student journals



Changing purpose of university press's



A University Press extends and enhances the university's reputation and supports its wider activity to align with institutional and wider HEI strategies

Universities increasingly have to demonstrate the impact of their research


It is in the university's interest that its research is widely read and used

Managing Student Journals

UCLPRESS responsibilities:

Providing administrative access to hosting platform and UCL Discovery.

To provide ISSN management.

To provide students the support needed to effectively run and manage a student journal, including:

- Support for overall design of site.
- Advising on copyright.
- Technical support.
- Guidance on registering journals with accreditation and indexing services.

Registering DOI's with CrossRef.

Assigning DOI's for all accepted articles.

Provide training:

- Upload of articles to UCL Discovery and UCL Research Publications Database (RPS).
- Hosting platform functionality and technical support and to provide platform instructions and documentation.

Article preservation and permanency.



Managing Student Journals

Student Editor responsibilities:

- To assign CC-BY licenses to authors of accepted article.
- To manage journal administration including the establishment of editorial boards.
- To define journal editorial policies and publish these on the journal home page.
- To publish article abstracts and article keywords.
- To create journal author guidelines.
- To customise the 'look and feel' of the journal website.
- To manage the submission and peer-review process, including quality control and all editorial decisions and pre-publication processes such as copyediting and typesetting.
- To be responsible for what is published, the frequency of publications and clearing of permissions to publish.
- To embed DOIs in the metadata and article PDF (DOIs requested from UCL Press).
- To create and publish the final issue, managing all aspects of scheduling publication.
- To ensure a full handover to successive journal editors, where these change annually.

For students to be fully supported, it is crucial there is faculty support to educate the Student Editors, in:



Editorial support. E.g. support correct and thorough peer-review



General guidance and motivation for content development



Academic and field of expertise level of support



Promotional support


I came to see how my studies can be positioned in a larger academic context and how I can grow as an academic.
