Who is the Postgraduate Students' Officer?

Over half of the students at UCL are postgraduates. As Postgraduate Students' Officer, it will be your job to make sure that their specific needs and voices are represented within UCL and the Union. You will lead campaigns on issues affecting postgraduate students and will represent their interests at UCL and nationally. As head of the Postgraduate Association, you will also create and run events for all postgraduate students at UCL.

What will you do as Postgraduate Students' Officer?

Throughout the year, you will be given the resources and opportunities to devise and lead your own campaigns, and to make sure the voice of postgraduate students are heard at UCL. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Lead the Postgraduate Association on campus
- Develop and run campaigns on issues that are important to postgraduate students
- Coordinate representation and campaigns to address the Doctoral School, UCL and local and national government
- Create and organise social events and activities to build a strong and supportive postgraduate student community at UCL
- Make sure that the Union is run in a way that engages and meets the needs of postgraduate students
