Travel

Underground

Unfortunately, few of the underground or mainline railway stations around Regents Park are fully wheelchair accessible.

However, some ambulant disabled supporters/visitors may be able to use them.

- Euston Square Station (Hammersmith and City Line, Circle Line, Metropolitan Line) is approximately 15-20 minutes from the facility. This station has the smallest step and gap and are suitable for most customers including wheelchair users. Other closer stations which might be possible to use are Great Portland Street and Baker Street as Regents Park itself does not provide step free access
- Euston Station (London Overground and Great Northern Rail) is around a 15-20 minute walk from the facility. Note: There are manual ramps that are on that you can book in advance. If you plan to travel on London Overground or TfL Rail, staff will be available at stations to assist you with your journey. You can pre-book assistance by calling 0343 222 1234*.

Buses

All Transport for London (TfL) bus routes are wheelchair accessible and have clearly marked priority seats for people with limited mobility. On most buses the wheelchair ramp is positioned at the exit door and there

is one wheelchair user place on each bus. The main bus routes that stop close to Regents park are the 205,30,18

Taxis

All London Style 'Black Cabs' are wheelchair accessible and can provide a suitable alternative to the bus or car. Black cabs can be hailed (stopped) in the street however you may prefer to book a cab to travel to or from the facility.

Uber Taxis also provide Wheelchair Accessible Vehicles (WAV). To book Download the Uber app and create your account (unless you already have one) then choose the 'uberWAV' option on the slider at the bottom of the screen and follow the instructions. If you would prefer to

book a mini cab, then there are several companies in Camden including.

Option A) The designated drop off points are located right by any of the gates that provide easy access since pitch location will vary week to week. This will be communicated in advance so the most appropriate gate may be selected

The entrances across the park, provide step-free access.


Accessible features at the venue

Accessible Toilets

There are a number of toilets located around the park however the large majority are not accessible. Often the accessible toilets are found next to places serving food and drink; these toilets are equipped as standard accessible toilets.

The wash hand basins all have lever type mixer taps. The wheelchair accessible toilets are also fitted with appropriate height mirrors, hand dryers and coat hooks and pull cord emergency alarms.

Below I have attached a photo of the wheelchair accessible toilets in the park.

There are standard male & female toilets dotted around the park however they mostly offer standard cubicles.

Tactile Guidance Pathway
