### **Policy: Active Bystander and Consent Training**

UP2201 – Active Bystander Training

All students at UCL are encouraged to complete the Active Bystander Programme in their first year of study.

The programme aims to train all UCL students to recognise and challenge problematic behaviours including bullying, harassment, discrimination, hate crimes/ hate incidents, and sexual misconduct both on- and off-campus. The programme also discusses consent. The module is part of our journey towards social and cultural change.

All candidates for the 2024 Leadership Race will be sent a reminder to complete the online Active Bystander module after nominations have closed on Monday 4 March.

The online Active Bystander module is currently part of the core training for all club and society welfare officers. Moving forward, it will also be sent out to all committee members to complete as part of the club and society committee training programme.
