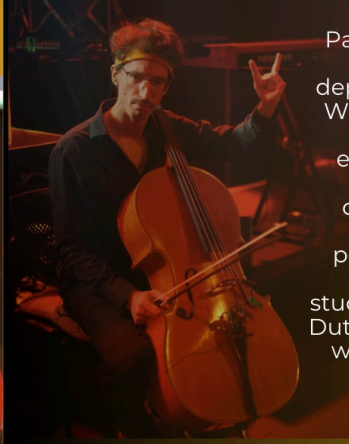
Violin:
