## Policy Briefing - Clubs \& Societies Postgraduate Officer

Activities Zone, May 2022

## What is the current situation at UCL related to this proposal?

UCL has over 23,000 postgraduate students, which makes up about $54 \%$ of the student body. ${ }^{1}$ Postgraduate students are eligible to join any club or society offered at the SU.

In the Term $1^{2}$ and Term $3^{3}$ by-elections this year, six clubs/societies had positions open for the role of Postgraduate Officer or Postgraduate Representative. ${ }^{4}$ No clubs or societies elected a postgraduate committee position during the Leadership Race held in Term 2. ${ }^{5}$

## What is the relevant national/ international context to this situation?

It is unclear whether other comparable London Students' Unions (LSE, King's, Imperial) have Postgraduate Officer roles for their clubs and societies.

## What would the next steps be if the proposal passed?

The Union would need to communicate to all clubs and societies this policy and set up the next by-elections to include the Postgraduate Officer role as default.
