


Welfare & Community Zone consultation: Union's Sustainability Training



Context

- Implementing a **student policy** proposed by the **Sustainability Officer** and passed through Welfare & Community Zone last academic year
- ➤ **Aim**: promote sustainability as a one of the values to be recognised and practiced by UCL students (echoing the Active Bystander training)
- To replace **existing sustainability induction**:
 - > low engagement
 - ➤ limited scope
 - > out of date
