Liberating the Curriculum

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What is a liberated curriculum?

- Challenges the current Euro-centric, white-hegemonic, male-dominated curriculum.
- Puts black, queer, disabled, and feminist contributions and critiques on an equal footing, in the curriculum.
- Fairly represents knowledge from these marginalised knowledge producers in UCL curricula, and acknowledges them as mainstream, rather than as 'other' and different from that produced by the dominant social category.

Liberating the Curriculum at UCL

- Working group established February 2015.
- Membership represents academics, professional services staff, library staff, and students.
- Looking at finding practical ways of introducing a liberated curriculum at UCL.
- Examining what this might mean across different departments and subjects.
