



Sports awards criteria

1. Club of the Year

The Club of the Year award is awarded annually to the club which has made the greatest overall contribution to Student's Union UCL Sports.

The following is taken into account:

- Range and level of activity (e.g. activities catering for beginners through to experienced players, chances to play variations of main sport, organising opportunities for non-members to have casual participation in club's sport etc.)
- Sports Development Awards
- Levels of engagement (e.g. social media, newsletters, emails different types of socials etc.)
- New developments and innovations
- Diversity of participation
- Support of SU campaigns (e.g. Pride in TeamUCL, Sustainability Week etc)
- Organisation and relationship with Student's Union UCL
- Connection with the wider community (e.g. volunteering projects)
- Inter-society activity and co-operation

2. Volunteering Sports Club of the Year

Awarded to the Sports Club which has made the best contribution to volunteering activity over the year based on the following criteria:

- Impact on wider community
- Benefits to UCL students
- Levels and range of activity and engagement

3. Diversity & Inclusion Award

This award does not have to be awarded if no nominations are felt to fulfil its criteria.

- The Club must illustrate a clear and strong commitment to the inclusion of persons within the UCL student community regardless of their ethnicity, nationality, age, religion, gender identity, sex, sexuality or disability.
- The Club must have demonstrated an outstanding effort to promote an environment free from bias and discrimination.
- The Club must have strengthened equality and diversity within their membership in the past academic year.
- The Club may have demonstrated a challenging of stereotypes for historically marginalised or minority groups, created a new committee position to represent

one or more minority or marginalised groups and/or enforced zero-tolerance to discriminating behaviour within their society. Illustrations of commitment to inclusion and strengthening diversity within membership are not limited to these examples.



4. Community Engagement Club of the Year

The Community Engagement Award will be awarded to the club that has done the most to engage its members online during the Covid-19 pandemic.

- The club hosted regular events.
- The club put on a range of different socials and fitness sessions.
- The club will have taken part in both TeamUCL lockdown challenges.

5. Louis Carr Memorial Award

The Louis Carr Memorial award will be awarded to the club who have supported their members' welfare throughout the academic year.

- The Club must have held a dedicated welfare event with successful engagement from their members.
- The Club should have contributed positively to mental health campaigns.
- The Club has created a welcoming and approachable environment for all their members.
- Welfare officer(s) must have attended the compulsory welfare officer trainings.
- The Club has promoted efforts to open channels of communication within their club with the aim of increasing awareness and discussion with their members on welfare issues.
