

RUMS Officer

The Medical School is a strong and important community of UCL students. As RUMS Officer, you will have a unique opportunity to lead and represent that community, making sure that the experience of studying medicine at UCL is academically, politically and socially fulfilling. You will meet regularly with senior University staff and represent UCL medics to organisations at national level to ensure that the voices of UCL medics are heard widely and their needs addressed effectively. You will also lead RUMS in continuing to build an engaged community amongst its students, and will create and run activities and events to achieve this.

What will you do as RUMS Officer?

In this role, you'll have the opportunity to shape the medical community at UCL and help make sure that RUMS reflects the values and interests of its students. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Be the convener of RUMS
- Represent the interests of medical students within the Union
- Meet regularly with the RUMS Honorary President and Dean of the Medical School
- Run activities and events for medical students
- Facilitate the relationship between UCL medical students and UCL Medical School alumni
