Who is the Arts Officer?

For many of us, clubs and societies are some of the most important parts of the student experience. The union offers dozens of thriving, talented and dedicated arts societies, and as Arts Officer, it will be your job to oversee them all and develop opportunities for students to get involved in the arts at UCL. Working closely with the Activities Officer, you will have a lead role in developing Arts societies in the Union and building community in and between these societies.

What will you do as Arts Officer?

As Arts Officer, you will have a great opportunity to make a lasting impact on Arts in the Union and at UCL. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Develop the Arts community within the Union
- Facilitate the running of Arts societies by students
- Make sure that Arts societies are as inclusive and engaging as possible
- Work with the Activities Officer to promote an inter-societal community within the Arts Societies, and the clubs and societies community as a whole
- Ensure that the interests of Arts societies members are represented within relevant decision-making processes, including Union Council

Who can stand?
