Who is the Disabled Students' Officer?

The voices of self-defining disabled students are essential in making sure that UCL and the Union are continually doing everything they can to ensure an accessible, welcoming and equal environment for all students. As Disabled Students' Officer, you will represent the needs and interests of disabled students in the Union, the University and beyond, and will have the opportunity to make meaningful change for disabled students. You will have the opportunity to create and run campaigns on issues that affect students with disabilities, build community amongst disabled students on campus and to work across the Union to improve accessibility throughout the student experience.

What will you do as Disabled Students' Officer?

In this role, you will have the opportunity to effect positive change for disabled students at UCL. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Convene the Disabled Students' Section
- Represent the interests of disabled students within the Union, UCL and beyond
- Run campaigns on issues relevant to disabled students
- Represent the Union at the NUS Disabled Students' Conference
- Sit on the Union Executive Committee

All students who self-define as disabled

What is involved?

You carry out this role alongside your studies for one academic year. It involves:

 - 5 Council meetings
 - A range of additional events
