Who is the Halls Accommodation Representative?

The quality and accessibility of Halls of Residence has a huge impact on thousands of UCL students every year. As Halls Accommodation Representative, you will represent the needs of students currently living in Halls to UCL and other authorities, and will play a leading role in campaigns for adequate, affordable and accessible housing for UCL students.

What will you do as Halls Accommodation Representative?

As Halls Accommodation Representative, you will play a key role in working to make sure that UCL treats its students fairly and provides good quality and affordable Halls. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Take a lead role in campaigning for adequate and fairly priced Halls
- Assist Halls Representatives and work with the UCL Cut the Rent campaign
- Work with the Welfare and International Officer, Halls Representatives and the Advice Service to make an impact on issues related to student Halls
- Be an active member of Union Council, Hall Rep meetings and other committees
- Report regularly on implementation of relevant Policy

Who can stand?

Students who have lived in a UCL or University of London residence in the past two years

What is involved?

You carry out this role alongside your studies for one academic year. It involves:

- Attendance at Hall Rep Forums
 - 5 Council meetings
- A range of additional events and meetings where required
