Who is the International Students' Officer?

Around a third of UCL's population is made up of international students. As International Students' Officer, you will be responsible for representing their interests and specific needs within the Union, at UCL and nationally. You will help and advise in the running of International Student Orientation Programmes and plan events aimed at international students. You will be a key officer in making sure that students from all over the world feel welcomed and at home within the Union.

What will you do as International Students' Officer?

You will play an important role in making sure the Union provides fully for the social, practical and academic needs of all international students. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Represent the voices of international students at UCL
- Create and run events and social activities for international students, working with national societies where possible
- Work pro-actively to improve the engagement of international students in Union activities and democracy
- Work with the Welfare & International Officer to develop the UCL International Students Orientation Programme
- Lead campaigns related to international students
- Convene the International Students' Section

Who can stand?

All students whose normal place of residence is outside the UK

What is involved?

You carry out this role alongside your studies for one academic year. It involves:

- Attendance at meetings of the International Students' Section
 - Fortnightly Union Executive meetings
 - 5 Council meetings
 - A range of additional events
