Who is the Institute of Education Students' Officer?

Since the merger between UCL and the Institute of Education, it has been incredibly important to make sure that the interests, needs and community of the IoE and its students are strongly represented within the Union. As Institute of Education Students' Officer, you will be vital in developing that relationship and making sure that the voices of IoE students are heard at every level in UCL and the Union. You will lead the student community within the IoE politically and socially, and make sure that studying at the Institute is a rewarding and fulfilling experience.

What will you do as Institute of Education Students' Officer?

In this role, you will have a unique opportunity to shape student experience within the IoE and its relationship with the rest of the university. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Represent the interests of IoE students within the Union
- Convene the IoE Students' Section
- Meet regularly with the Director of the IoE along with other senior academics
- Develop the IoE community by creating and running events for IoE students as well as for the wider UCL population
- Facilitate the relationship between IoE students and alumni
