## Who is the Societies Officer?

For many of us, clubs and societies are some of the most important parts of the student experience. Including national, religious and career-networking societies and many more, the Union offers well over 100 General Interest societies, and as Societies Officer, it will be your job to oversee them all and develop opportunities for students to pursue a rich range of interests at UCL. Working closely with the Activities Officer, you will have a lead role in developing and building community between General Interest societies in the Union.

## What will you do as Societies Officer?

As Societies Officer, you will have a great opportunity to make a lasting impact on clubs and societies in the Union and at UCL. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Develop the Societies community within the Union
- Facilitate the running of General Interest societies by students
- Make sure that societies are as inclusive and engaging as possible
- Work with the Activities Officer to promote inter-societal community within General Interest societies, and the clubs and societies community as a whole
- Ensure that the interests of societies' members are represented within relevant decision-making processes

Societies Officer shall be elected by members of Students' Union affiliated general interest societies at the time of the voting period commencing
