Who is the Sports Officer?

For many of us, sports clubs are some of the most important parts of the student experience. From rugby and fencing to kitesurfing and dodgeball, the Union offers dozens of dedicated sports teams and clubs, and as Sports Officer, it will be your job to oversee them all and develop opportunities for students to get involved in a rich range of sports at UCL. Working closely with the Activities Officer, you will have a lead role in developing sports clubs in the Union and building community in and between clubs.

What will you do as Sports Officer?

As Sports Officer, you will have a great opportunity to make a lasting impact on sports in the Union and at UCL. With training and support from Union staff, you will:

- Develop individual clubs and the Sports community within the Union
- Facilitate the running of sports clubs by students
- Make sure that sports teams are as inclusive and engaging as possible
- Work with the Activities Officer to promote inter-societal community within sports teams, and the clubs and societies community as a whole
- Ensure that the interests of sports club members are represented within relevant decision-making processes
- Help to coordinate charity events such as Movember and the annual calendar
